A Spiritual Journey

The hardest thing I ever had to do was to let go of my self-will and turn my life over to the care of God. It has also been the best thing that has happened to me since I discovered OA. Through my first honest prayer, I sought knowledge of God's will for me and the power to carry that out. But I didn't know how to really pray. So I started simply by talking to God. Then I would sit quietly and just let my thoughts and feelings drift in and out of my mind and heart. That gave me time to hear what God might be saying back to me.

Many times when I've been sitting quietly, I have had some intuitive thoughts or ideas about how to handle a problem that is troubling me. Situations I thought were impossible have miraculously worked out because I remembered to let go of MY will, and let God's will be done. - Voices of Recovery 11/1

The stories of many OA members disclose that the existence of God became real to thm only when they experienced surrender and spiritaul awakening in this program. A number of these individuals had always believed in God, and some were active members of religious demoninations before coming to OA.

One does not need prior belief, however, to have a spiritual experience. In the OA literature and at meetings, we find atheists and agnostics who describe their surrender of the problem and acceptance of a spiritual solution in the same terms.

Spiritual experience is open to all. If it does not come immediately, be willing to wait in the knowledge that it will come as a result of working the steps.

Sometimes I don't feel that wonderful spiritual feeling that I had when I was newer in the program. Where did it go? I had it yesterday. I just can't get that veil of protection, comfort, and direction that I have when I am in conscious contact. It can't be a lack of trust for that is centered deep in my heart. I long for the feeling of being spiritually connected and in a total state of trust and acceptance. I long to see my world bubbling in miracles each moment. Have I lost my spirituality? Am I being somehow directed to return to step three? Am I losing my recovery? Why can't I find God's grace? Where have I gone astray?

In truth, my spiritual status is just as God has directed. It is in my actions. It is in each healing word I share with a friend. It is in each kind thought I send to someone in trouble. It is there each time I help my neighbor or carry the message or volunteer my time. It is letting in the car trying to merge into your lane. It is in the patient understanding I have with someone who is still suffering with our disease.

Living the spiritual solution takes action. It begins with kind words, then moves to kind thoughts and deeds. It rests at last in my heart with the warm feeling that I have made this world a little bit better place. That is the best spiritual feeling I can imagine.

LEARNING TRUST

When I first came into OA, I believed my life was in order. I felt happy with my food; I just wasn't happy with my food. I had everything else under control, except that I didn't drive. I rarely had on unpleasant feeling. As soon as I became the least bit uncomfortable, I pulled food around me like a blanket. I was happy, happy, happy. The only other emotion I could express was rage. I lived like o baby in a fantasy state, while trying to run my family's lives. The first lesson I learned in OA (after admitting I was a compulsive overeater) was that I had no power over my loved ones' lives and that I was responsible for making choices about my own life.

Although I came to OA with a faith in a loving God, it took years to put my trust in that God.

Food finally drove me to the point where I knew that if I didn't fully surrender, all was lost. I mark my recovery from that day in October 1978 when I stood at the bottom and totally "let go and let God".

Today I know that God has given me the twin gifts of abstinence and sanity, and that my

responsibility is to open my heart and mind to the steps of this program. My daily choice is whether or not I will accept those gifts.

Almost without fail, I start my day with step eleven, which directs me to improve my conscious contact with God, as I understand God, through pray and meditation. Throughout the day, I attempt to practice the principles of my program in all my affairs, carrying the OA message by example rather than coercion. I am deeply grateful for the places I can go to hear OA spoken by my fellow recovering compulsive eaters around the world.

Thank you all for being there for me and with me.
