SNI Vice Chair report for June 2025

- On May 3rd, I attended part of a workshop on Zoom security that was presented by the Foot Steps Virtual Intergroup. I learned new techniques for dealing with intruders, some of which I had heard of, but hadn't understood how they worked.
- I enjoyed spending May 4-10 participating in the World Service Business Conference and associated workshops, etc.
 - o It was a great opportunity to grow in recovery and the joy of this program!
 - o I had the opportunity to mentor a WSBC Green Dot (first timer).
- I also enjoyed the Region 5 Convention in Brookfield, WI, May 23-25. It isn't too soon to start planning and saving to go to a convention. The 2025 World Service Convention is August 21-23, 2025, in Orlando, FL. The next Region 5 Convention will be in Indianapolis, IN, September 6-8, 2026. I expect the Milwaukee Area Intergroup Convention is usually in March, so watch for that next year.
- Some thoughts and quotes gathered at the Region 5 Convention:
 - o OA's rate of recovery is 100% for those who follow suggestions.
 - Respect others enough to not be their HP.
 - You can choose discipline or regret.
 - In a quiet moment before a meeting, I ask HP, "Let me hear what you want me to hear & say what you want me to say."
 - Negative self-talk will take me to the food.
 - o I was asked, "How long do you think you've been using food as a drug?"
 - If you are in a meeting, you have a chance to recover. (Go to as many meetings as possible.)
 - Do service to find out that OA is bigger than your meeting.
 - It's dangerous to consider leaving OA.
 - Everyone has a higher power—whatever they turn to in a time a need.
 - Service is where I found my recovery.
 - Do not refer to those who disrupt Zoom meetings as Zoom bombers, but rather as intruders. (We have OA fellows for whom explosive bombing is a fact of life.)
 - Zoom intruders are looking for the lowest hanging fruit, so they generally pick on the first meetings that come up in a search.
 - Food is not the 8th wonder of the world nor the solution to my problems.
 - O When I commit my food, I don't have to think about it.
 - The party is not on the plate, it's with the people.
 - Gratitude is an action.
 - o Program takes a lot of work—so does this disease!
 - May I hurt no one and be a blessing to some.
 - o Recovery is an inside job. The outside will change if I change the inside.
 - o Prayer work. It may not change the circumstances, but it changes me.

2025 WSBC report to SNI by Susan M.

Thank you, SNI, for the opportunity to do service at WSBC this year. This was my fourth WSBC, and the first time I participated virtually. It was a different experience while still offering opportunities to stretch and grow in service and recovery and to connect with Fellows from around the world. While it isn't for everyone, I am grateful that I caught the vision early in my intergroup experience.

Rather than write a narrative, I have chosen to separate my report into various sections with bullet points to make it easier for you to find what is of interest to you.

Theme: To Carry the Message is Our Primary Purpose

Interesting stats:

- 199 registered voters, 52 Green Dots (first time delegates)
- 100 registered visitors (who could go to the workshops/forum)
- Delegates were from 27 countries: Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Costa Rica, Denmark, England, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Iran, Israel, Italy, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Poland, Russia, Scotland, Spain, Sweden, United Arab Emirates, United States, and Wales.
- 17 languages were represented: Danish, Dutch, English, Farsi, Finnish, French, German, Greek, Gujarati, Hebrew, Italian, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Swedish, and Welsh.
- Each business meeting was opened with the Serenity Prayer said in two languages (the second being English): Gujarati, Dutch, Arabic, Welsh, and Finnish. In the recovery meetings, the prayers and other readings were shared in even more languages.
- Conference 7th Tradition total was \$4277.

- Find a Meeting reimagined update
 - This project will take a lot of money and time to complete. Please give generously with money earmarked for Find a Meeting.
 - A relational database is replacing the original flat data base.
 - Finding and updating meeting information will be much easier, with attributes able to be searched for and updated separately.
 - Much of what is in notes now will be in searchable fields.
 - o Each meeting will be asked to provide contact information for 2 people.
 - There will be a process to keep meeting information current. If the information hasn't been updated within a year or similar amount of time, a request will go out to the contact people. If there is no response in 6 months or a similar amount of time, then a request will go to the region. If the information still does not get updated or verified, the meeting will be deleted from the database.
 - When changes are made, the service body and region will be notified.
 - Service bodies and regions will be able to link directly to Find a Meeting, so all the meeting listings will agree.
 - There will be a way to report if you went to a meeting, but didn't find it.
 - For virtual meetings, searches will no longer be restricted to day and time.

Committees:

- There are 6 Conference Committees that are made up of delegates and a Trustee Co-Chair:
 - Bylaws
 - Conference Approved Literature
 - Public Information/Professional Outreach

- Young Adults
- The only conference committee/subcommittee that was scheduled to meet during WSBC week this year was the Reference Subcommittee, on which I served. We are tasked with problem solving when motions are confusion, contentious, redundant, have received more than 2 amendments, or are otherwise problematic. This year we worked on three motions and considered 2 emergency new business motions.
- Reference is a subcommittee of the Bylaws Committee. Therefore, I am also on Bylaws.
- Bylaws has three other subcommittees:
 - Everyone Has a Voice subcommittee will be working on making the Agenda
 Questionnaire process more effective so members understand the process and
 give their voice by completing the questionnaire.
 - Introductory Manual to the Bylaws Committee subcommittee will be developing a how to guide for new members of the Conference Bylaws Committee.
 - Trustee Application Process subcommittee will be looking for ways to improve the trustee application process.
- I expect to serve on the Bylaws Committee and the Everyone Has a Voice subcommittee until the next WSBC.

- The 2024 Contributions report is posted on oa.org. (Chose Menu, News & Events, World Service Business Conference, and look at the list of Frequently Used Documents.)
- There is a new weight-based shipping calculator used for orders from the OA Bookstore.
- Websites oa.org and lifeline.oa.org have built-in translation in forty-eight languages.
 - Twenty-three languages currently cover more than 99% of all non-English meetings.
- Support OA's digital communications
 - Post your OA events on the Event Calendar on oa.org.
 - Encourage your service body's social media administrator to follow OA's social media channels and like, comment, and share OA's social media content.
 - Facebook.com/overeatersanonymousofficial
 - Instagram.com/overeatersanonymous official
- An emphasis on self-care and balance, especially for those serving at an assembly or a convention, leads to more peaceful service for all involved.
- Region 9 serves more than 100 countries with more than 40 languages.
- OA's current strategic goals are to grow membership and grow the number of members who have strong recovery.
- Most of the oa.org Document Library documents are now mobile-friendly and translatable.

- There is a *Traditions Workshop and Study Guide* that is expected to be submitted to WSBC 2026.

 - B (Add to the end of the 3rd paragraph of the Unity with Diversity statement: For example, this means we do not try to convince any member or visitor to adopt a belief in God.)
 - 3 (amended to change the number of Trustees to 16 instead of 17)
- Defeated
 - 2 (add requirement to trustee application to state 2 strategies ...)
 - 4 (removing that 55% of all groups need to respond to possible changes to the Steps and Traditions in order for those changes to take effect)
 - 5 (removing gender reference from the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions)
 - 6 (have all WSBCs virtual)
- Emergency New Business (ENB):
 - At least two motions were submitted as ENB, but they were ruled not ENB.

Board of Trustees

- Trustees elected for the next 3 years:
 - o Blair P (Appointed in 2024, Region 6)

- Bob L (Appointed in 2021, just finished first 3-year term, Region 7, is the new Chair of the BOT)
- Juliette R (Region 5, is now the Region 5 Trustee Liaison)
- Preston F (Appointed in 2024, Region 5, is on the Executive Board)
- During this Conference, the number of Trustees on the Board was changed to 16. We now have 15. The Board decided to send out a call for applications so they can fill the vacancy by appointment.

Heard/learned in a meeting or workshop:

- Calls to fellow OAs are called In-reach calls (as opposed to outreach).
- Recovery is when you stop wishing for a different past.
- Deficits are frequently good characteristics taken too far.
- Despair and resignation are the swamp of inertia.
- White lies are still lies.
- Service is about boundaries and sharing experience, strength, and hope, not about saving others.
- My default position for change is to go to the food.
- Now I don't have a whole past to deal with, just today and some triggers.
- I used food to keep myself safe from others—to not allow you to see me.
- I am safe now, and I wasn't before
- I am recovered from the symptoms, not the disease.
- We carry a message of hope, unlike other weight management programs.
- If you want to know if you have a thinking problem, try meditating.
- The beautiful concept of trusted servant. Not perfect, but humble, open, clear enough to live in 10, 11, & 12.
- OA can be the real family of the heart.
- It's not (just) about losing weight—the real fat is in the mind.
- Progress is not linear, it is more like a spiral (in layers).
- Do service because it is fun.
- Service is a great opportunity to practice (and grow in) recovery.
- Identify and motivate the right person for the job.
- What is one brave thing I can do this year to promote OA?
- No purpose = lack of usefulness
- The 7th tradition isn't just about money—it's about service, too.
- Recovery is developing a balanced perspective on food and life.
- Recovery is living life without food obsession.
- What STST applies to this problem/situation? (Step, Tradition, Slogan, Tool)
- I want to trust God's will rather than manage others' reactions.
- You recover to pass it on.
- The beautiful language of OA recovery is universal.
- I used to try to be a miracle worker (to be good enough). The miracle is that I don't have to anymore!

- Watching the AI closed captions added extra humor to business sessions, for example:
 - When someone was trying to locate an interpreter, the caption said "Is she still a cook?"
 - o "new to OA" became "Noodle away"
 - "same books" became "sandbox"
- Some suggestions for Public Information, Professional Outreach (PIPO) and Twelfth Step Within (TSW):
 - Have a marketing service help get PSA's broadcasted.
 - Put posters on public buses.
 - o Use streaming services on connected TV, and OTT (Over The Top) advertising
 - Check city and state websites for recovery resources (then provide them with OA resources).
 - Arrange to have posters at service stations during travel/holiday seasons.
 - Leave OA business cards in various places.
 - Use posters with QR codes to take people to websites/literature.
 - O Ask meetings to pick a month to put on a workshop.
 - Call five and keep them alive.
 - Don't know what to say when making an outreach call to a fellow OA? Try this:
 "Hi, this is _____ from the _____ meeting. I have been thinking of you, and I wanted to say hello."
 - Be welcoming without being overwhelming—use gentleness, kindness, and curiosity.

World Service Business Conference 2025 Delegate Report Submitted By:

This was my second opportunity to be of service as Suburban North Intergroup's elected delegate at World Service Business Conference. Last year I traveled to Albuquerque, New Mexico with members from Suburban North Intergroup and several members within Region 5 whom I met while attending Region 5 Assemblies over the past few years. This year the business conference was held online via Zoom. This was a unique opportunity for me to serve. I feel very lucky, and thankful to have participated in service at this level. This was an exciting week for me filled with miracles!

First, because it was part of my position as your delegate I attended *meet the maker* meetings before the conference. At these meetings delegates listened to reasoning behind motions directly from the individual who wrote the motion. While attending these meetings I realized the importance of allowing individuals to express themselves. I practiced listening with compassion and curiosity because each member has a voice, and collectively we will all decide the direction, and changes made to this program of recovery that continues to amaze me: Overeaters Anonymous 12 Step Program.

The conference was scheduled Sunday May 4, through Saturday May 10, 2025. *Sunday*, May 4, I attended an "All About Conference Virtual Workshop". This was necessary so that members understood etiquette while online at the conference. Since I attended last year's World Service Business Conference 2024, I did have a working knowledge of general procedures. I felt attending this "All About Conference Virtual Workshop" was helpful as I received a review of procedures, and what the conference would entail each day.

Monday, I attended a Virtual Workshop dedicated to encouraging each participant to dig deep and think about how each might explain OA to someone we meet in an elevator. The point is, I would only have the time in the elevator ride to explain what OA is to me, "My Elevator Speech". I attend a 12 Step group called Overeaters Anonymous, similar to AA. This program and my involvement in it enlighten me to live life in the present. I have learned to experience my feelings instead of running from them via food, or overeating to dissociate from life, or eat to stuff my feelings. I learn to eat balanced meals, and to stay present for all parts of my life; family, work, friends, and fun!!

Tuesday through Saturday, OA Recovery Virtual Meeting took place at 9:00am before the business meetings. These meetings helped me ground to the experience of being at this virtual conference as the attendees were all WSBC delegates or participants. My being seemed to seek this out each day. Each day I felt a stronger connection to the event, and the bigger picture, "To carry the message is our primary purpose"! Forgot to mention earlier, this was the theme of the conference. For me personally, I am on a journey of discovery. On any given day the discovery may manifest itself differently, yet the purpose remains the same. My purpose continues to center around change, growth, and healing through the 12 Steps of Overeaters

Anonymous. While attending the OA Recovery Virtual Meetings my purpose vibrated through me stronger than ever. This might have been because every individual in the OA Recovery Virtual Meetings was on the same journey, and we were each about to embark on the important decision making process together during the Business Meeting soon to begin (just after the OA Recovery Virtual Meeting).

Tuesday through Saturday, business meetings took place to discuss, be a part of a caucus, debate, then vote on motions. It was exciting to be a part of the caucus (in a separate virtual room) and listen to different reasons members felt a certain way about a motion. While listening, as well as when voting, I remembered "primary purpose is for the good of OA".

The motions that were most meaningful to me are the following: Adopted:

- (1) Motion A, Changing the name of Young People's Conference Committee to Young Adult's Conference Committee.
- (2) **Bylaw Amendment 10**, Allow unaffiliated meeting to choose whether to affiliate with their geographic region or the Virtual Region.
- (3) <u>Motion C</u>, In keeping with Tradition Ten, Overeater's Anonymous has no opinion on surgical or other medically recommended methods of weight management. In the spirit of Tradition Three, Overeater's Anonymous welcomes anyone with a desire to stop eating compulsively.
- (4) **Motion B**, Adding a sentence to the Unity with Diversity statement. "For example, this means we do not try to convince any member or visitor to adopt a belief in God".

The following were defeated and were among the most meaningful to me:

- (1) Bylaw Amendment 4, Removing the "at least 55% of the registered groups have responded" to possible changes to the Steps and Traditions in order for those changes to take effect.
- (2) **Bylaw Amendment 5**, removing gender reference form the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions.
- (3) **Bylaw Amendment 6**, have all WSBC virtual.

A vital part of the WSBC is the reference committee. When a motion was not passed as written, changes to the verbiage are suggested, and if still not passed a certain amount of times, this motion is sent to reference committee. I did not have the opportunity to sit in a reference committee meeting, but it seems that this committee works diligently to rephrase proposed wording to preserve the maker of the motions intent. I was amazed at how the power of words could illicit different reactions within myself.

The biggest take away for me is witnessing this process; speaking one's truth, seeing and hearing the division of perspectives, listening to the collective consciousness, and finally

receiving the reference committee's proposed new wording. I'm not sure why, but I felt the presence of a higher power each time the reference committee presented new wording for the motions/bylaw amendments which would then be voted on. I strongly suggest this experience and service work for you all, if you are up for an experience beyond your wildest dreams!
